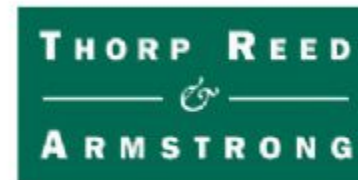

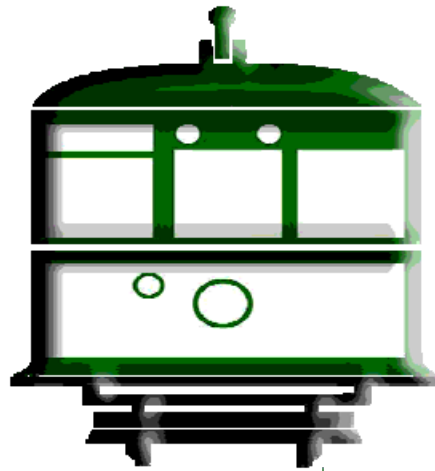
TRAIN CAPITAL CORP®

Last month Tram purchased a private equity hedge fund based in Boston called Cambridge Capital. Cambridge Capital caters to extremely wealthy individuals who has assets in excess of \$10 million. Cambridge clients are based all over the east coast, including the Delaware Valley. Tram has now decided to extend its brand and is renaming Cambridge Capital to Tram Capital Corp. and is planning to incorporate its logo (see below).
